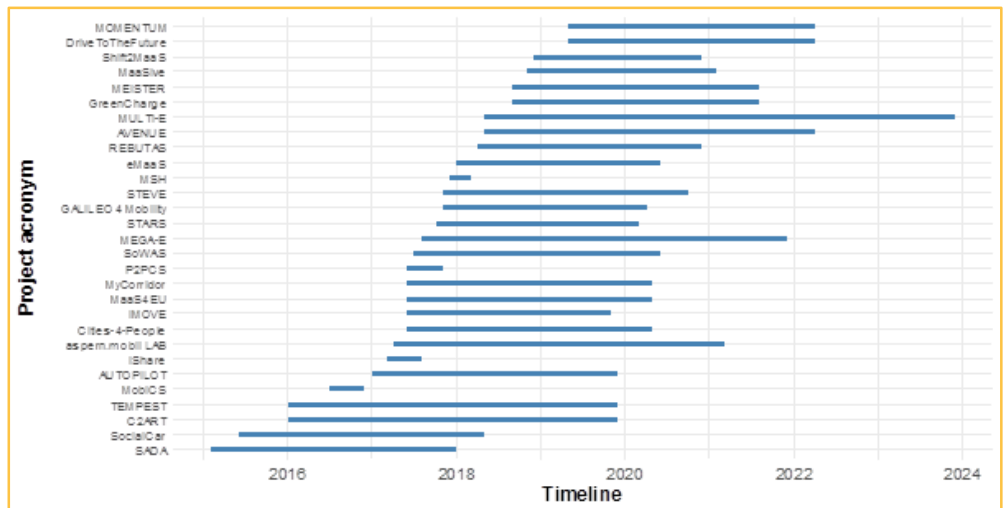


Figure 1: Timeline of projects covering shared mobility (source: TRIMIS)

The TRIMIS database has a large number of national and EU-funded projects on shared mobility. Figure 1 shows a selection of 29 projects since 2015 (keywords include car sharing, MaaS and on-demand services). On average, these projects have a duration of more than 2.5 years and are organised across Europe.

Shared mobility is often analysed in parallel with other novel mobility concepts, such as electrification and autonomous vehicles. Researchers are analysing the topic with a forward looking and integrative approach.

Compared with the period before 2015, more projects in shared mobility are being funded. This illustrates the growing interest that the topic receives. Additional project-specific information can be obtained from TRIMIS by searching for the project acronym listed in Figure 1.

#### MOMENTUM - Modelling Emerging Transport Solutions for Urban Mobility

Duration: 2019–2022

Disruptive technologies, such as Mobility as a Service (MaaS) and connected autonomous vehicles, are bringing radical changes in urban mobility. The goal of MOMENTUM is to develop a set of new data-analysis methods, transport models and planning support tools that are able to capture the impact of new transport options on urban mobility, which will support cities in the task of designing the right policy mix to exploit the full potential of emerging mobility solutions.
